Results	<p>It is difficult to take much meaning from the published results as although our group was competing in the Palma/sling class, this included some people who were shooting heavier bullets of the same calibre (with resultant less effect of wind) and some were using telescopes. A further subdivision put Ian/Angus/Mike in High Master Class and Sandy/Euan in Master Class, with separate lists for each. In addition, it is almost impossible to win a competition outright, as a second group shooting any calibre are included, and they generally have a distinct advantage.</p> <p>Wednesday 11th – 600 yards A warm day with relatively light fishtail winds. Scoring was high. (This was not part of the Grand Aggregate)</p> <p>Ian Shaw was the winner of the purely Palma Rifle Sling Class (but not the outright match winner who used a different calibre). He had the only maximum score of 600 ex 600 in this class – a very steady shoot, finishing 1st, 5th, 5th in the 3 individual matches and 1st overall. <p>Outline of travel and accommodation logistics</p>	<p>WGT arranged flights and extra bag per person (i.e. rifle box). The coach booked vehicles and accommodation. A house was rented for the duration of our stay, which is both more economical and better for keeping the group together than a hotel. In addition, it is more secure, as several of the hotels in the areas that we would have expected to stay have been suffering spates of break-ins to vehicles.</p> <p>The coach also ordered the necessary ammunition from our trusted US supplier.</p>
<p>Outline of Competition Logistics</p>	<p>Unlike the UK, all the individual shoots are string fire (one person per target shooting at any time) to a strict time limit for the overall shoot. Also, the shoots have many more counting shots than in the UK – typically we shoot 7 or 10 to count and occasionally 15, in the US they generally shoot 20 to count at any given range, as National Records can only be set for that number of shots. Typically there are 4 people squadded to a target, with two marking targets in the pits (butts), one firing and the other scoring for the firer. The firer and scorer then change place for a second relay (detail) and then the target-marking pair change with those on the firing point for a third and fourth relay. This leads to a very busy day as, after firing starts in the first competition of the day, every shooter is occupied continuously until firing ceases in the third competition or range fired that day – there is no specific lunch break.</p> <p>At meetings such as this, they are keen to include team matches in the programme, as team shooting is rarely practiced in the US and it is an opportunity to give people a chance to coach and be coached. In the UK we have a better mix of team/individual matches and with the specific HPS training for CG, our group should have a slight advantage in this format, other than not having the same experience of the specific range as the locals. Teams did not have to be club teams – scratch teams were encouraged to ensure as many people as possible shot.</p> <p>Tuesday 10th – Shooters Clinic It started with a talk by Brian Litz (Berger Bullets Ballistician and the World’s foremost authority on ballistics) on ballistics and handloading. Then there was a position check for all firers, by the top US coaches, followed by a wind class, led by Mid Tomkins, former US Palma Captain and Coach, at 1000 yards. During this session, there was instruction on flag and mirage reading followed by a series of shots from an expert shooter with the wind calls being explained and evaluated. The final part of the day was pairs-firing with two shooters at 1000 yards, the idea of which was to make the US shooters actually read the wind rather than chase the</p>

	<p>spotter – however, for UK shooters who are used to firing in pairs/threes, it was more of an opportunity to familiarise themselves with the range and the markedly different aim picture from the UK, as well as acclimatising to the very bright light and high temperatures. The temperatures during the week peaked at 32 C and most days were over 25 C.</p> <p>Wednesday 11th – 3 shoots of unlimited sighters and 20 shots to count at 600 yards.</p> <p>Thursday 12th - teams of 4 shooting a Palma course (15 shots to count at 800/900/1000 yards with unlimited sighters at the first range and 2 only at 900 and 1000).</p> <p>Friday 13th Individual Palma course</p> <p>Saturday 14th - 2 shoots at 1000 yards, 20 to count in each, followed by a team match at 1000 yards, with 20 to count per firer.</p> <p>Sunday 15th – 2 shoots at 1000 yards, 20 to count in each.</p>

Outline of Competition logistics	The British Championships are made up of 2 Aggregate competitions which the athlete can choose when to shoot within a number of scheduled relays. The actual Championships are at a set time, in this case on the Saturday for Rifle and Sunday for Pistol, with finals for the top 8 in the Qualification. Unfortunately the target systems at Bisley have not been upgraded for sometime so athletes competing in the Rifle events do not see the Decimal score building as they shoot, only the Integer score is visible. Timings were as they would be as per ISSF matches and there was equipment control with random tests performed.

Outline of travel and accommodation logistics	All travel and accommodation arrangements were made with the help of British shooting as there were a significant number of GBR shooters making this trip and it was seen as a good thing to keep all British shooters together. In this respect it worked well.						
Outline of Competition logistics	<p>ISAS has for years run a very good competition focusing on the Olympic rifle disciplines with the (welcome) addition of Womens Prone. As such it provides a very good opportunity to evaluate where shooters are technically prior to the major competitions which usually follow ISAS in the calendar. For this reason it has been a staple part of the Scottish Rifle programme for many years.</p> <p>There are limited firing point for 50m (37) which does mean multiple relays for all events. This can mean a very early start in some cases and a final very late in the day.</p> <p>There is not full equipment control nor sample testing of equipment after competition. Only a cursory check of rifles beforehand. Timings of matches and finals (where run) are as ISSF requirements.</p> <p>Always a very good standard of competition though this year (Olympic year) the entries were a little down on previous years.</p>

Outline of Competition logistics	<p>This event takes place over 3 days. There are 2 Prone matches (Men & Women), 1 3x20, 2 3x40 and Air Rifle though no Scottish athlete shot any air rifle at this event. There were also finals shot for 3x20, 3x40 and for the second prone match, with the nice addition of a Women's Prone final not normally seen in ISSF style competitions.</p> <p>Logistics would dictate that those shooting one of the 3P matches were unlikely to be able to shoot both Prone matches.</p>
